

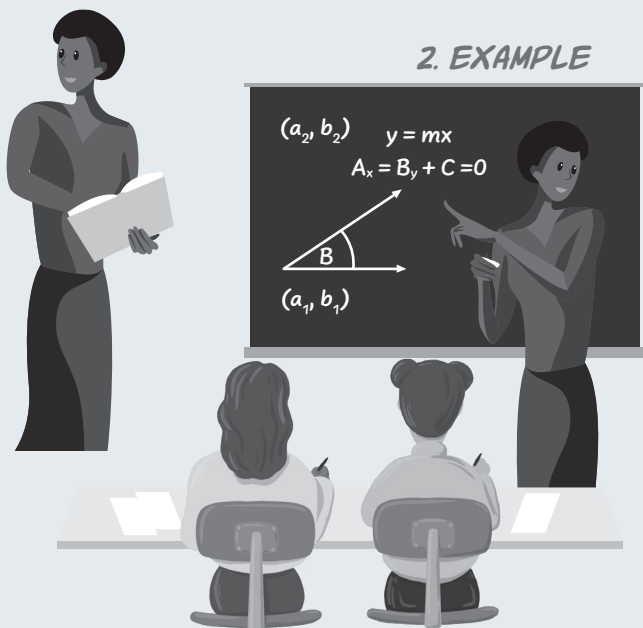

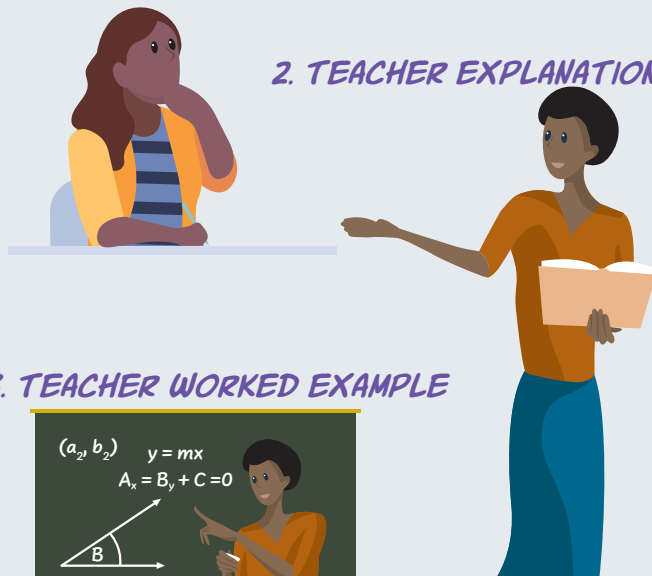
Instead of a lesson flow like this...

WHY TRY IT?

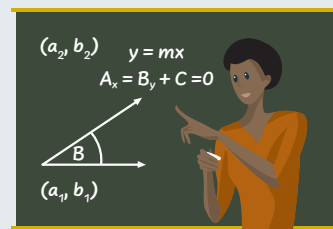
- Develops problem-solving skills

Partial ideas, incorrect approaches, and complete solutions can all inform the discussion that follows. Use student attempts to shape what you emphasize in your explanation.

Do not expect students to solve problems completely or successfully, they just need to try.
